Summary of Catch Up spending 2017/18

Background and Objectives

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools an additional £500 for each year 7 pupil who did not achieve [the expected standard](#) in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

At Wapping High School, this money is used to fund additional interventions and resources in literacy and numeracy so that every student arriving below expected standards in maths or English has additional support to achieve expected levels of progress.

All students take the NGRT reading tests and baseline numeracy tests at the start of the year to assess their needs and to establish which intervention will be best suited to their needs. Student progress is carefully tracked at the end of each half termly module to assess progress and to adapt intervention strategies. If students make rapid progress in English and maths at the end of a module, their intervention is reviewed and if this attainment is considered to be secure they may no longer receive intervention. The NGRT reading test is re-taken by all students at the end of the academic year to review progress and to plan for any additional reading intervention needed in Year 8.

Programme for 2017/2018

Intervention for Maths

Students have two additional hours of numeracy delivered by a maths specialist using materials from the National Numeracy Strategy, Passport Maths and Times-tables Rockstars.

Intervention for Literacy

Small group literacy intervention is delivered by LSAs weekly, using the reading programme Read Write Inc. Students also work on Lexia in school and at home which is a personalised programme to develop spelling and reading skills.

Impact to date : 2017/18

Progress of Year 7 students in maths and English

<p>1. Maths intervention by a maths specialist Small group numeracy catch up sessions are delivered on a weekly basis by a maths specialist to secure basic numeracy skills. Students taking part in these sessions are identified using KS2 data and baseline tests. Some EAL students new to the UK are also included for this targeted intervention if baseline testing identifies a need.</p> <p>2. Literacy Intervention with LSA Small group literacy intervention is delivered by LSAs for up to three hours a week using Fresh Start. Use of Lexia has been introduced as an alternative personalised programme.</p> <p>LSAs are also deployed to provide extra support in maths and English lessons to increase student progress and differentiation for Catch up students.</p>
